## Minority Scholarship Fund

The purpose of the Minority Scholarship Fund is to grant scholarships and fellowships to qualified non-Caucasians in order to enable more of them to study at Bob Jones University and to be prepared in the essentials of knowledge and the Christian faith. In order to effectuate these purposes, the group from which grantees shall be selected shall meet the following criteria:



- 1 ) Potential grantees shall be of African-American, African, Asian, Native-American, or other non-Caucasian descent.
- 2 ) Potential grantees shall have demonstrated academic ability and spiritual leadership.
- 3 ) Potential grantees shall have demonstrated financial need.

Grantees shall use grants to pay tuition required for enrollment, fees, books, supplies, and equipment required for courses of instruction at Bob Jones University.

Bob Jones University is vitally interested in training students who will graduate and serve Jesus Christ worldwide.
